This week the U.S. Supreme Court was petitioned by two abortion doctors in Louisiana to block a new state law that will otherwise go into effect this coming Monday. The abortionists are asking for an emergency stay while they make an appeal. The Law at issue, Act 620, requires abortion providers to obtain admitting privileges at a hospital within 30 miles of their clinic. This will necessitate the closing of one of Louisiana's three abortion clinics.

Not long ago, an identical law was passed in Texas, but it was subsequently overruled by the Supreme Court in 2016. This time, we have new judges on the bench. Their decision - possibly within the next 24 hours - will not only have an immediate impact on the abortion industry in Louisiana, but it will also give the other states an indication of whether this new Court is ready for Roe V. Wade to begin to be challenged.

Bob Jones warned us years ago that even after getting the right judges in the court, we must not stop praying for them. He expounded on 1 Timothy 2:1-2, explaining how the demonic realm is consistently warring for influence over the men and women in these seats of government. Intercession is needed to maintain the influence of heaven over their lives. The reality is that for God's justice to prevail in our nation we need a praying remnant presiding in the heavenly court above the Supreme Court.

Along these lines, Chris Berglund had a dream a few nights ago in which a number of God's people were being summoned to a "mandatory court appearance." He recognized many of their faces and knew they had served in the heavenly courts before as intercessors for the ending of abortion. In the dream it was now time for the ten sons of Haman to be brought to justice and hung on the gallows (Esther 9:8-10). For these intercessors to gain the inheritance they had labored for over the years, they needed to see it through to the end.

Also in Chris' dream, he was aware of an evil entity that was aligned with the partaking of the body and blood of the children. In contrast, those who took communion, agreeing with the broken body and shed blood of Jesus, had power over this evil one.

TRUMP SUSPENDS ARMS TREATY, CITING CHINESE, RUSSIAN THREATS

Father, give our leaders Your wisdom in decisions concerning our national security.

The Trump administration is pulling the plug on a decades-old nuclear arms treaty with Russia, lifting what it sees as unreasonable constraints on competing with a resurgent Russia and a more assertive China. The move announced Friday sets the stage for delicate talks with U.S. allies over potential new American missile deployments....

"The U.S. threat to terminate the treaty will not bring Russia back into compliance and could unleash a dangerous and costly new missile competition between the United States and Russia in Europe and beyond," the private Arms Control Association said. It argued that Washington had not exhausted options for drawing Russia back into compliance.

Trump said in a statement that the U.S. will "move forward" with developing its own military response options to Russia's banned deployment of cruise missiles that could target western Europe.

"We cannot be the only country in the world unilaterally bound by this treaty, or any other," Trump said....

Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, speaking to reporters after Trump's statement, said Russia will be formally notified on Saturday that the U.S. is withdrawing from the treaty, effective in six months. In the meantime, starting Saturday, the U.S. will suspend its obligations under the treaty.

Pompeo said that if, in the coming six months, Russia accepts U.S. demands that it verifiably destroy the cruise missiles that Washington claims are a violation, then the treaty can be saved. If it does not, "the treaty terminates," he said....

INF was the first arms control measure to ban an entire class of weapons: ground-launched cruise missiles with a range between 500 kilometers (310 miles) and 5,500 kilometers (3,400 miles). At the time, in the late stages of the Cold War, the U.S. and its allies were mainly concerned by the perceived threat of Russian medium-range nuclear missiles that were targeted at Europe. The U.S. deployed similar missiles in response, in the 1980s, leading to negotiations that produced the INF treaty....

"The administration's ideological aversion to arms control as a tool for advancing national security is endangering our safety, as well as that of our allies and partners," Smith said. "The risk of miscalculation or misunderstanding is already higher than at any point since the end of the Cold War, and this decision only makes it worse."

U.S. officials say they have little reason to think Moscow will change its stance in the next six months.

"We have raised Russia's noncompliance with Russian officials — including at the highest levels of government — more than 30 times," Pompeo said. "We have provided Russia an ample window of time to mend its way. Tomorrow that time runs out."...

Trump said his administration will move forward with developing military response options. But senior Trump administration officials said they don't expect any immediate testing or deployment of weapons that are banned under the treaty. The current Pentagon budget includes \$48 million for research on potential military responses to the alleged Russian violations, but U.S. officials said the options do not include a nuclear missile.... THANK GOD--LARGEST FENTANYL DRUG BUST IN HISTORY

U.S. Customs and Border Patrol seized enough fentanyl to kill over 50 million people from a truck that was trying to cross the southern border into the United States, according to an investigation by "Tucker Carlson Tonight."

"Well, the U.S. border patrol has made the biggest fentanyl bust in history. An enormous amount, enough fentanyl to kill—they estimate—57 million people. That's more than the combined population of the states of Illinois, New York and Pennsylvania. It's a lot," Carlson stated. "We got our hands on an internal memo from U.S. Customs and Border Patrol that details this bust. The biggest fentanyl seizure in U.S. history," Fox News Correspondent Hillary Vaughn began. "According to the memo, four days ago in Nogales, Arizona, at the port of entry, CBP officers stopped a tractor-trailer crossing the U.S.-Mexico border into the U.S. with enough fentanyl to kill 57 million people. That's plenty of fatal dose to wipe out the entire populations of Texas, Arizona and New York state combined."

She continued:

They found this under the floor of the trailer. They found 114 kilograms of fentanyl. According to the DEA, just two milligrams is considered a lethal dose. They also grabbed 179 kg of methamphetamine and one gram of fentanyl in pill form. The street value for the fentanyl over \$102 million. The CBP officers arrested the smuggler, a Mexican national who attempted to drive the drugs across the border. The suspect was a part of the DHS's trusted traveler program

called FAST, that stands for free and secure trade for commercial vehicles. The program started after 9/11.

The bust comes as President Donald Trump is trying to secure funding for a wall he would like to be built along the southern border to prevent smuggling and illegal immigration. SARAH SANDERS: 'GOD WANTED DONALD TRUMP TO BECOME PRESIDENT'

In a wide-ranging exclusive interview with CBN News, White House Press Secretary Sarah Sanders says that God wanted Donald Trump to become President of the United States.

"I think God calls all of us to fill different roles at different times and I think that He wanted Donald Trump to become president," Sanders told CBN News Chief Political Analyst David Brody and Senior Washington Correspondent Jennifer Wishon in her West Wing office Wednesday morning.

"That's why he's there and I think he has done a tremendous job in supporting a lot of the things that people of faith really care about," Sanders said....

"Anytime somebody who's not even associated with the President says something, the first thing is will you condemn. Will you say that this is terrible?" she asked.

"Where's the leadership on the Democrats' side to call this out? It is unbelievable that this is going totally unchecked, totally off the radar of most of the mainstream media."

On the topic of immigration, Sanders lowered the hypocrisy boom on House Speaker Nancy Pelosi. The White House Press Secretary said Pelosi's view that a border wall is immoral is absurd and a comment she may come to regret.

"Honestly, it's very hard at this point to even take a lecture from Democrats on what is moral and what isn't," Sanders told CBN News. "People who are willing to allow legislation to pass supporting late-term abortion. The idea that they would take out "So help me God," in the platform that House Democrats have raised this week. But the idea that protecting the people of your country, which is the fundamental duty of being President of the United States, would in some way be immoral is a ridiculous charge and something that I think probably, I would think Speaker Pelosi may even regret making that comment." ...

Despite concerns by evangelicals over US policy in Syria, evangelicals have been more than satisfied with President Trump during his first two years in office....

"Whether or not there's a daily press briefing, people in the administration, myself included, do regular interviews as I'm doing right now, after a lot of those interviews stop and take questions outside where anybody, any reporter is allowed to come and ask questions," Sanders noted. "I think the White House, in general, is the most accessible when it comes to the media. You know, we had a briefing this week and they complained and complained and complained that we don't have them, then we have one, and CNN and MSNBC didn't even cover it. So, I think that the biggest thing is that they just want to complain and attack this administration and this President and they don't want to cover all of the successes because that's not good for the narrative that they're trying to drive."...

"The goal is to be the best version of who God created us and who he called us to be," Sanders noted. "Some days I do that better than others, but the goal is always to be open about my faith. I think it's part of the reason it gives me a sense of calm when I'm in that room." ...
