Day 1 Friday, October 30 Join us to pray together on our Prayer Webcast

As we approach what is arguably the most contentious and the most critical election in our lifetime, let us come together as a body of intercessors to pray. You can join the webcast at www.ifapray.org/live or visit the IFA website to view.



Day 2 Saturday, October 31

Prayer walk the polling places in your area. Cover the voting tabulation locations in prayer.

Visit <u>Vote Your Values 2020</u> to "Pray the Vote." Vote tabulation locations can be prayed over virtually by using the map. Here are some prayer points to pray as you pray walk, either virtually or in person:

Every place where you set your foot will be yours (Dt 11:24)

- Proclaim the blood of Jesus Christ over the area you are walking. (Eph 2:13)
- Speak peace wherever you go: "Peace, peace, to those far and near, "says the Lord. "And I will heal them." (Is 57:19)
- Pray that believers would exercise their civic duty and vote biblical values.
- Pray for citizens who live where you are prayer walking to recognize and accept God's design for government. (Acts 26:17-18)
- Pray that candidates will take brave stands for righteousness, even when it may not be well received. (Is 7:9)
- Pray for open eyes for citizens to see good as God sees it and evil as God defines it. (Gal 1:3-5)
- Pray for no plan of the Enemy to circumvent the election process. (Is 54:17)
- Pray for citizens who live where you are prayer walking to recognize and accept God's design for government. (Acts 26:17-18)



Day 3 Sunday, November 1 Pray for those fellow believers at your church body, that they would vote on Tuesday.

- Pray that pastors would reclaim their rightful position in society as leaders in the culture, advocating biblical values, addressing these issues with their congregation and speaking out in the community. (Is 61:1-4)
- Pray for the Church to engage in civic responsibilities such as voting, speaking out on issues, participating in candidacies, election management, and praying for the election process. (1 Cor 16:13)



Day 4 Monday, November 2 Remind friends and family to vote.

Remind friends and family to vote personally or through social media. Offer to take elderly and/or infirmed friends to vote. It's not too late to offer the biblical Voter Prayer Guide to them use as guidance. Fast and pray for the election.

Day 5 Tuesday, November 3 Vote! Pray at the polls!

While you vote, pray. Pollsters and campaign volunteers stand around at the polls. You can too! Pray quietly and unobtrusively.

Gather with other intercessors to pray, virtually or in person! Share this prayer for election day, provided below. It is a good reminder for them to pray before they vote.

- Pray for believers to turn out in greater number than ever before to vote in this election. (Pr 4:5-6)
- Release blessing for godly authorities to occupy the seats of office in the upcoming election. (Rom 13:1)
