



Where the Spirit of the Lord is, There is Liberty

...wherever the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. So all of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord—who is the Spirit—makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image.

2 Corinthians 3:17-18 (NLT)

Here's how you can pray:

Although 2 Corinthians 3:17 is a verse commonly used when talking about civil and governmental freedom, this is unfortunately a misuse. Yet, in the correct context, this passage provides freedom in ways that go beyond any religious freedom provided by authority. Please consider praying:

1. Praise God our faces are unveiled.

Unlike Moses, whose face glowed powerfully after the mountaintop experience with God, we do not have to cover the display of God's presence in our lives.

Lord, remind me every day as I interact with those around me that I display the very fact that I have been in your presence. May all who around me notice You through me.

2. Ask the Lord for transforming power today.

The regenerating, sanctifying, supernatural power of God works in us every day. Each day we live is an opportunity to be transformed in his image.

Lord, may You grant me the supernatural remembrance to pursue Your transformation today. May Your Spirit touch my spirit daily to impart this thirst to be more like You.

3. Ask the Lord for fresh revelation of His glory.

The passage intends to communicate our opportunity to be aware of more of God's glory every day. The "more" does not run out, it is ever increasing.

Lord, I ask You for increased revelation of Your glory. Would You please, today, help me to be more in awe of You than yesterday?

These two Bible verses define what true freedom is: Ability to bring glory to God, daily transformation, and increasing awareness of His glory. No authority or government can limit or legislate this true freedom. No circumstances nor life events can keep us from this freedom. May you experience this today.
