Election 2024 Prayer Strategy

Many of us are deeply concerned about our nation. And we might experience daily anxiety as we watch the news or read opinion pieces predicting that this election will be the last for our "democracy" (though what we really are is a *republic*). If *this* candidate wins, we're told, he'll use the government against us; if *that* one wins, he will be a dictator.

With the 2024 primaries in full swing, the Lord has directed me to a passage familiar to all of us: *Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts* (Psalm 139:23 NIV). This passage helps us know what to do in times like these.

God Has an Antidote to Anxiety

Psalm 139:17 reminds us that one antidote to our anxiety is to consider: *How precious to me are your thoughts, God! ...* (NIV). When we start feeling anxiety over the condition of our nation, we can pause and ask God what *He* thinks.

We Can Trust God to Act

Psalm 139:19 says: If only you, God, would slay the wicked! ... (NIV). It's easy to become frustrated with what looks like a two-tiered justice system in our country, the constant demonization of biblical values, and the endless graspings for power. There is not one person, one group, or one committee that can fight and win the battle for righteousness. We must get to the same point where David was — and rely on God to frustrate the ways of the wicked.

God Leads Those Who Ask Him

Psalm 139:24 records David's conclusion: ... lead me in the way everlasting (NIV). David's request is that God show him the path to what's eternally true. These days of moral relativity — in which people define their own "reality" and then expect everyone else to play along — require us to ask God for guidance and direction. David did not ask for patience to sit back and endure: David asked to be led on the path of everlasting truths. Did you catch that? History has never been impacted by someone sitting on the couch doing nothing.



Our Prayers for the Election Will Surely Make a Difference

It is impossible to overstate the impact of men and women of Christlike faith asking God to move, and then following His leading. It is vital for God's people to be engaged in the election process and to ensure that His "everlasting ways" are at the very center of our government's actions.

In eight months, we will elect our next president. Primaries, caucuses, candidates, and conventions dominate the news. Political fortunes are said to rise and fall with the latest poll.

Some Christians are out zealously working for candidates. Others, perhaps the majority, disdain politics, refuse to stay informed, and will not even vote.

We must decide whether the elections are in fact worth praying for. Our action will be no stronger than our conviction. IFA believes that the election process should be of the utmost concern to Christians. Here's why:

It's important to God.

For there is no [governing] authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God (Rom. 13:1)... the Most High is ruler over the realm of mankind, and bestows it [the realm] on whom He wishes ... (Dan. 4:17 NASB). If this is important to God, then it should be important to His people!

It's important for us.

When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice; but when a wicked man rules, the people groan (Prov. 29:2). Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people (Prov. 14:34).

We enjoy a choice of who will serve as leaders.

Most people in the world don't. The freedom of choice is a God-given freedom; it reflects His nature: ... choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve ... (Josh. 24:15) — this describes that freedom, but also reminds us that great responsibility goes with it. From him to whom much is given (freedom), much is expected (wise stewardship of that freedom).

God's doing is tied to our praying.

Through prayer King Hezekiah, whose heart was toward God, was healed and his reign was extended (see 2 Kings 20), and through prayer the captivity of an entire nation was ended (see Dan. 10). God will show us how we are to pray. "... Blessed be the name of God forever and ever, for wisdom and might are His. And He changes the times and the seasons; He removes kings and raises up kings; He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to those who have understanding" (see Dan. 10).

Here are ways in which we can pray — ways that are pleasing to God:

- that God would raise up the righteous and put down the wicked (Job 20:4,5; 34:24);
- that God would expose the hidden motives and evil in unrighteous candidates;
- that those seeking office would fully and truthfully declare their positions on abortion, sexuality, the protection of children, religious freedom, national defense, and immigration;
- that the media would not cause candidates' political positions to be distorted;
- that Christians would realize that apathy is a curse, and that we would rise to the opportunity God is giving us.

Finally, let us boldly put our confidence in God! The election won't be determined by the media, the elite establishment, China, or what happens in the Middle East.

In Thee, O LORD, do we put our trust!

A Legacy of Answered Prayer

Exactly 5O years ago this month, IFA mailed out its first newsletter to concerned Americans with a passion to pray for the nation. The amount of labor needed to create that newsletter was enormous — from the careful typesetting to the bulk-mail bundling. Today, our operating processes have changed dramatically, of course, but the mission is the same.

IFA was one of the first national prayer ministries, dedicated to joining Christians to pray strategically, with endurance, and in agreement for the purposes of God in our nation.

When we first began mailing out monthly calls to pray, America was enduring what President Gerald Ford called a "long national nightmare." The country was experiencing a plethora of problems: the Watergate scandal, the Vietnam War, the Arab oil embargo, the Roe v. Wade decision, a growing toleration of drug abuse and sexual immorality, and many other challenges that were radically changing the way Americans lived and thought.

It was a historic year for the office of president of the United States. In October of 1973, just before IFA was formed, Vice President Spiro Agnew resigned, and Rep. Gerald Ford of Michigan was chosen to replace him. Because of the Watergate scandal, President Richard Nixon faced impeachment, and he resigned in August 1974. Vice President Ford then assumed the presidency. He had never been elected, nor had he ever sought to become president. He is the only president in U.S. history to take this particular path to the office, and he is therefore a unique figure, and his tenure was thus an unlikely one.

One of the first things President Ford said in his inaugural address had to

do with prayer: "I am acutely aware that you have not elected me as your president by your ballots, and so I ask you to confirm me as your president with your prayers. And I hope that such prayers will also be the first of many," he stated with disarming humility. And he closed with another humble statement: "God helping me, I will not let you down."

Thus, one of the very first answered prayers IFA intercessors ever celebrated was that of the inauguration of a president who believed that the prayers of the citizens would prove essential to his ability to lead effectively. Ford knew that he needed God's help and the prayers of the people. This was most certainly an answer to prayer.

In 2024, we mark the 60th presidential election in our nation's history. IFA intercessors have prayed through 12 national presidential elections. This year let's take courage from the lessons of the past. God does hear and answer the prayers of His people, and He moves in unlikely ways.

We declare that unrighteous judges and leaders will be exposed and cast out of their places by His mighty hand (see Ps. 34:7–9).
